1. Call to Order – Pledge of Allegiance

2. Review of Agenda

The Board will consider corrections or additions to the agenda of items requiring immediate action that have come to the attention of the District following the posting of the agenda.

4. Water Report and Informational Items

5. Public Participation

At this time, members of the public may address the Board on matters that are not on the agenda, which affect the operations of the District and are within the jurisdiction of the Board. The President may limit the time allowed for comment. (Members of the public may also address the Board on any matter on the agenda, when that item is brought up.)

6. On-Farm Water Conservation Projects

It is expected that one or more on-farm conservation projects that have previously received preliminary approval from the Water Conservation Policy Committee will be ready to present for final approval and funding. The Board will be asked to approve incentive grants and/or loans for the projects, and to authorize the President and Secretary to execute loan documents on behalf of the District.

7. Pumping of Private Wells for Water Credits in Federal Districts in 2014

The Board will be asked to review and approve requests from CCID landowners who wish to pump private wells for water credits for their own properties in neighboring Federal districts in 2014.

8. 2014 Transfer(s) Based on Following

One or more CCID landowners are expected to request permission to follow a portion of their land in CCID in 2014 in order to be able to transfer water to other ground that they own in Federal districts. The Manager will present details of the requests, and the Board will be asked to approve the transfers for 2014.

10. Monthly Financial Report

The Secretary will present figures through March 31 for revenues and expenses in comparison to the 2014 budget, receivables, investments, and the reserve funds for water conservation loans and projects. No Board action is expected to be taken.

General Counsel, the Executive Director and the Manager will discuss with the Board current issues affecting the Exchange Contractors and CCID. Board action may be requested on any of these matters.

12. Miscellaneous Business
